Your Women's Health Primary Care Provider offers personalized health care to address your unique concerns as a Veteran. Women's Health Primary Care Providers are primary care providers who have special training or experience in routine reproductive healthcare.

While receiving health care at VA, you have the right to choose the gender of your primary care provider. You also have the right to choose the gender of the chaperone who will be with you for any visit, procedure, or invasive test.

Women Veterans Call Center

The Women Veterans Call Center (WVCC) is your guide to VA. All calls are answered by women, many of whom are Veterans themselves, who will help you navigate VA, answer your questions about VA services and benefits available to you, and connect you with the Women Veterans Program Manager at your local VA medical center. This service is free, and you can call as many times as you need.

Office of Women's Health is committed to supporting the health of all Veterans. We take a holistic view of reproductive health, including physical, mental, and social well-being.

Reproductive health services are those related to care for the reproductive health system. These services include fertility and infertility services, access to family planning, maternity and postpartum care, lactation support, care for pelvic pain, management of urinary incontinence, support of sexual function, reproductive mental health, and management of perimenopause and menopause.



REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH SERVICES

Routine reproductive health services include diagnosis, treatment, management, and screenings related but not limited to

- Pre-pregnancy and postpartum health
- Genetic counseling
- Birth control and family planning
- Infertility, fertility, and family building
- Emergency contraception
- Sexually transmitted infections (STI)
- Breast/chest health, including breast/chest cancer screenings and mammography
- Maternity care coordination
- Cervical and gynecological care, including Pap tests
- Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccination
- Menstrual health
- Perimenopause and menopause
- Urinary health, including infection and incontinence
- Vaginal health, including symptoms such as infection, discharge, and dryness
- Anal health
- Sexual health

You can receive specialty reproductive health care at your local VA or through community care, as needed.

GYNECOLOGIC SERVICES

Gynecologic services include diagnosis, treatment, and management, including surgical management, of concerns such as:

- Pelvic and abdominal pain
- Menstrual irregularities and pain
- Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome (PCOS)
- Abnormal uterine bleeding
- Uterine fibroids •
- Vulvar and vaginal disorders
- Urinary incontinence
- Menopausal symptoms, like vaginal atrophy, • hormone replacement, libido changes
- Abnormal cervical screening results •
- Vulvar, vaginal, cervical, uterine, and ovarian cancers ٠
- Sexual health concerns
- Fertility assessment
- Infertility
